## **Qualitative insights**

- Curriculum as linking agent:
  - 'Institutional educational point of view' <> 'learning / teaching activities' (study programme)
  - 'Policy' <> 'implementation,
  - 'Intended LO' <> 'achieved LO'

Curriculum forms the spine and framework of the educational components



#### **Opportunities**

- Expand traditional focus (B-M-D) to associate degree (short cycle)
- Add the meaning of a curriculum in terms of stacking study certificates (PAC, PAQ)
- Suggestions on how to integrate 21st century skills needs further conceptualization (and support)
- Clarify on how to deal with freedom of choice, selfmanagement and independent learning as an attitude

## **Concluding considerations**

- Focused continuation needed, whilst maintaining the broad view of the horizon
- Inserting an external view and keeping a curriculum up to date is of great importance for quality
- Bad shaped curricula puts diploma under pressure
- Curriculum makes the value of what one does in education clear
